



Financial Stability

Goal: The current congregation provides offerings sufficient to meet current costs/expenses.

2023 First Quarter Financial Summary



To cover expenses budgeted for 2023, weekly offerings have to average \$3,924. So far in 2023, general offerings have been averaging \$2,652 per week. At that rate, we will finish 2023 at a deficit of \$66,144. We do have access to other income from such things as fees/rentals for using church facilities and grounds, along with distributions from the Bleecker and Sprague funds. However, those sources will come far short of the \$66,144.

The following chart gives a comparison of first quarter revenues and expenses for 2023 compared to those in 2022.
