October and God's Glory By Pastor Brian R. Lightner

Greetings, Church! October has arrived and that means a couple of considerations for us, here in the beautiful Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Firstly, it means we are moving from warmer weather to chillier weather. October, much like May, transitions from one way of living in and around nature to another. Secondly, October brings with it the realization that a new year is approaching, but it is still a way off into the foreseeable distance. Likewise, this fall and the beginning of winter, we prepare ourselves for All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and the New Year. In many ways our faith journey with Christ can be understood in light of what it is to be like the month of October. Christians experience transitions in their faith walk. These transitions are much like the natural transitions that take place in autumn of any year. They are inevitable as faith matures and grows. Autumn and winter transitions are like spiritual transformations, they occur no matter what because time marches on.

2 Corinthians 3:17-18 (NRSV) states, "(17) Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. (18) And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another, for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit." October is known as a month where all the leaves fall from the trees. In the October of our faith journeys, we are losing the leaves in our own lives. These leaves are places that dim our view of God. These leaves are the places in our lives that hide God's glory and keep us away from freedom that sees God's glory.

Here is a guiding prayer for you for the next few months. You can find it also in the United Methodist Hymnal #412. This prayer is known as the *Prayer of John Chrysostom*. This prayer captures that salvation is pardoning justification for us now and for everlasting life. In this life now we can only see a part of God's glory because of the limitedness of the world around us. However, salvation enables us to do good work because we know that we have been saved by grace through faith alone. We do our good work as the seasons change. We remember that in Him, someday we will finally get to see God's full glory.

Almighty God, You have given us grace at this time. With one accord to make our supplication to you. And you have promised through your well-beloved Son. Granting us in this world knowledge of your truth, And in the age to come life everlasting. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
