
O God, You are the true source of wholeness and peace.

Jill's congregation has adopted three families that are Afghan refugees who are coming to America. There are coming with nothing and need housing and all that comes with a new house in the Oshkosh/Milwaukee area.

I shared this information during worship earlier this year, and we at Trinity were able to look at those needs and help with some of the household items. Those items have been categorized and are in storage for those families.

The families have not arrived, and there is a delay in the arrival. I have reached out to the Appleton church, and there is no further need at this time.

I will keep you posted on the Afghan refugee situation and update you on any further help we can offer. Thank you for your generous donations. —Jennifer Rietveld
